RE: Advertising campaign by the Australian Government

I refer to the Government's radio advertising campaign promoting the recently signed Free Trade Agreements in Asia.

An example of a radio advertisement (audio file) recently aired in Adelaide is attached to the email carrying this letter.

Referring to the 2014 Guidelines on Information and Advertising Campaigns by non-corporate Commonwealth entities, issued by the Department of Finance, I would be grateful if you could investigate whether the abovementioned campaign breaches these guidelines, or indeed any other guidelines or legislation.

I note that the China-Australia Free Trade Agreement (ChAFTA) is yet to be ratified by Parliament and is the subject of much public debate.

In particular, I would be grateful if you could consider the following:

 The Independent Communications Committee is required to consider campaigns and provide advice where a campaign is valued at more than \$250,000.

Could you please indicate whether an exemption was granted in this case and whether your office has the power to look behind the veracity of any exemption?
